## **Educational Cabinet Shared Decision Making Discussion Items**

## I. Staffing for 2022-2023

The district has posted several positions already on OLAS. These are positions that there were no internal candidates for (music, social worker and counselor position). If we have a strong candidate pool we will start the interview process soon.

Ashley Gershen will fill the Curriculum Coordinator position in our building next year. Congratulations Ashley! Jim can now move forward at looking at other internal moves and talking with people who showed interest.

## II. Discussion Regarding Schedule

Jim created a draft schedule taking into account information and feedback shared. Following review and feedback, Jim will also meet with Jamie Bearor to ensure that we can cover special education needs within the proposed schedule.

Highlights from the **March minutes** related to schedule are below:

- Some requested changes can be made to the schedules.
- We can now fit 4 grade levels in the cafeteria.
- Approximately 10:45-1:00 is the time the cafeteria can serve lunches.
- Six grade levels requested lunch at approximately the same time (overlapping), and obviously this cannot happen.
- The hope is thal lunch start times can be separated by 10 minutes (long lines)
- Jim tried something with the 5th grade specials in the am as requested with F-L still in the pm.

Jim asked cabinet members to take this back to their teams for feedback. Remember, almost any change impacts something else. Intervention (WIN) blocks are staggered to allow service providers to meet with students.

### III. Room Locations for 2022-2023

We need to begin a discussion regarding future classroom locations and *what's best for student learning*. (The continued hope is that COVID restrictions will not impact our building as it has the past two years). As we have gotten smaller we should look for opportunities that may exist.

- Consider the number of sections/students per grade level. Clusters can easily accommodate 6 sections and we now have 4 or 5 and this will likely continue to decrease.
- 2. How can we minimize the time students requiring the most intensive services are spending transitioning each day? Location matters.
- 3. Are we able to utilize one location to deliver special class services instead of 2?

Below is the number of homerooms by grade level, based on current and predicted enrollment trends. Unless enrollment trends change, it is likely that the number of sections/number of rooms needed will continue to decrease.

There was discussion around the potential for K-1, 2-3 and 4-5 groupings in clusters with sixth grade in its own separate location. This discussion has happened in past years, but now with fewer sections, it's easier to have serious discussions. What are the opportunities that these groupings would provide? There was discussion about instructional benefits, intervention benefits, etc What are the disadvantages? There was discussion regarding 6th grade students and their connection to other levels. We discussed leadership opportunities for all students being important. We will send a survey to get feedback from staff on their thoughts.
