Additional sources are noted throughout the report and include other data from the state Education Department, and information supplied by the Office of the New York State Comptroller. Data in the report are the most recent available as of June 26, 2015.

The overall score, on which the *Business Review* bases its main rankings, is a weighted tabulation that takes into account the following five categories.

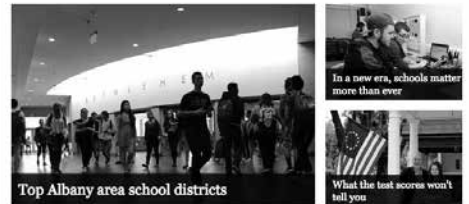
5. Graduation is a weighted score that takes into account the percentage of students who graduated with a Regents diploma with an advanced designation, the percentage of high school completers and the percentage of seniors who plan to attend college or some form of post-secondary school.

2015 guide to Capital Region schools

Welcome to the online edition of the Albany Business Review's Schools Report, an annual study of public school education in the 11-county Albany, New York region.



1. Language/Reading takes the total of the percentage of elementary and middle school students who met or exceeded state standards on the English assessment tests, and high school students who received a 65 or higher on the English Regents.

2. Social studies takes the percentage of students who received a 65 or higher on the global history and geography, and U.S. history and government Regents exams.

3. Science takes the total of the percentage of fourth- and eighth-grade students who met or exceeded state standards on the science assessment tests, and the percentage of students who scored 65 or higher on all of the science Regents exams.

4. Math takes the total of the percentage of third- through eighth-grade students who met or exceeded state standards on the math assessment tests, and the percentage of students who scored 65 or higher on all of the mathematics Regents exams.
