Grants for STEM

The High School Robotics Club will be able to build on its first year success thanks to the efforts of Mr. David Wurzberger and Senator Betty Little. Mr. Wurzberger, of the Exit 20 Jolley Mobil, nominated Lake George Jr.-Sr. High School for an Exxon Mobil Educational Alliance grant in the amount of \$500. The district also received \$5,000 in Bullet Aid from Senator Little. The funds will be used by the technology department to support the VEX Robotics Club. The fledgling club, while only in its initial year, earned a spot in the New York State competition last season.

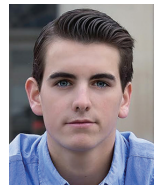

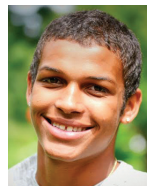

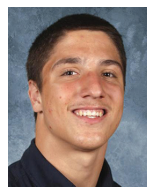
