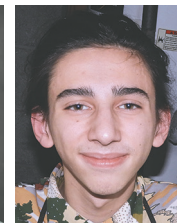

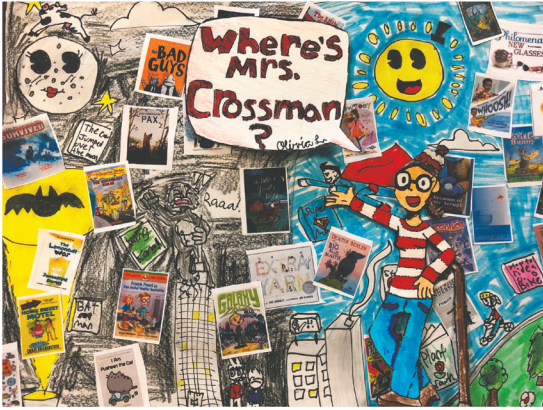

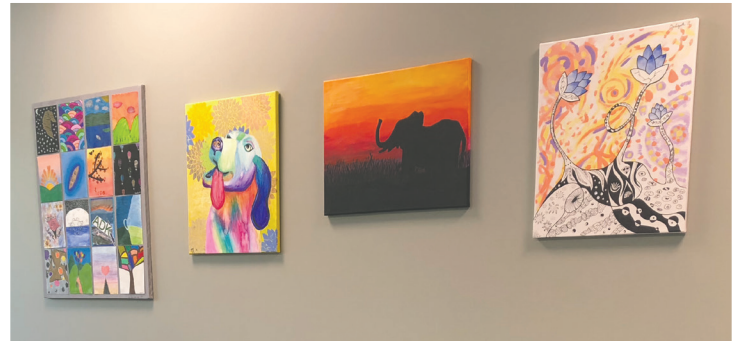

Students Donate Original Artwork to Warren County Family Courthouse for Permanent Exhibit

Lake George Central School District was proud to partner with the Honorable Paulette Kershko, Family Court Judge, to create and install a permanent student art collection in the new wing of the Warren County Family Courthouse.

Lake George Art Teachers Allison Laurin, Erin Connolly, Michele Niedermeyer, and Katherine Casey worked with their students to explore themes of “family,” “peace,” “integrity,” “love,” and “kindness” and create artwork with the intention of donating it to the Warren County Family Courthouse.

Lake George art students created original works for the permanent display, while the teachers mounted the art for presentation, designed the exhibit, and helped install the pieces with Warren County staff members. Approximately 50 Elementary, Middle and High School students created 37 artworks installed within the Children's Art Gallery and Family Court waiting area.

"We are thrilled to share some of the beautiful artwork our students created," said Lake George Art Teacher Erin Connolly, who conceived of the idea for the permanent collection with Judge Kershko and Secretary Beth Gillingham. "Our hope is that this collection will continue to grow."

"Anyone who has walked in our hallways knows how talented our students are, and now, through this exhibit, a larger number of people in the community will get to see their talent and be inspired by the beauty they created," said Lake George Central School District Superintendent Lynne Rutnik. "I would especially like to thank our exceptional art teachers for their help and enthusiasm with this special and uplifting project."

Considering a Capital Improvement Project

Lake George Central School District is in the beginning stages of developing a capital improvement project. Items under consideration were identified in the district's Building Condition Survey, which was completed in 2016. The district will conduct needs assessment surveys over the summer, as well as community forums to gain input on areas to be addressed for the long-term sustainability of the buildings and grounds.

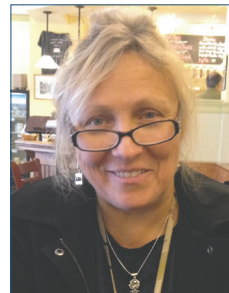
The most recent capital project was approved by voters in February 2015. That \$2.8 million project included safety items such as a secure vestibule at the Elementary School and new doors/hardware at the Jr.-Sr. High School.

Funding for the potential project would come from a Capital Reserve Fund that was established in 2016 and financing to replace retiring debt. Approximately 10% of the cost will be refunded in the form of NYS Building Aid. The district's five-year master facilities plan is located on the district website for review.
