What to Expect



A Guide for Parents and Guardians of Lake George Jr.-Sr. High School Students



Guiderooms begin this year:

Beginning in 8th grade, students are placed into small homeroom groups we call "guideroom." These groups stay together with the same school advisor until graduation. That's five years of spending each and every morning together. The philosophy behind guideroom is that students and advisors can develop relationships that will enhance support and reinforce a sense of belonging within the broader school community.

Eighth Grade: A time to sharpen skills.

<u>Responsibility and Self-Advocacy</u>: Students are encouraged to develop skills and habits which foster independence and self-reliance. We no longer utilize monitored student homework folders. When absent, students should seek the necessary materials and information missed.

<u>Utilize the supports available</u>: Probation cards are used to help students involved in extra-curricular activities maintain good academic standing; 10th period is a great time to communicate with teachers (students must be with a teacher or activity); 10th period review classes are often provided for exams. Collaboration with classmates for studying and projects is also a great idea.

<u>Time Management & Organization</u>: Daily monitoring of projects and assignments. Students should use a planner or calendar function on a phone to help with organization.
